Vehicle control training is a crucial part of preparing future drivers. Instructors emphasize that students master all necessary tasks safely and confidently.



Basic Controls:

1. Steering wheel:

- Proper grip and steering.
- Responding to changes in direction.
- Controlling the vehicle in turns.

2. Pedals:

- Accelerator pedal: controlling speed.
- Brake pedal: slowing down and stopping.
- Clutch pedal (for manual transmission): shifting gears.

3. Gear lever (for manual transmission):

- Proper gear shifting.
- Using the clutch.

4. Handbrake:

- Using it for parking and starting on a hill.

5. Turn signals:

- Signaling changes in direction.

6. Lights:

- Using dipped, high, and parking beams.
- Using hazard lights.

7. Vehicle Maneuvering:

- Starting and stopping:
- Smooth starts.
- Smooth stops.

8. Driving forward and reverse:

- Maintaining a straight line.
- Reversing with surrounding awareness.

9. Parking:

- Parallel parking.
- Perpendicular parking.

10. Turning:

- Turning in tight spaces.
- Turning at intersections.

11. Vehicle checks:

- Checking mirrors.
- Monitoring the dashboard.
- Checking blind spots.
